Major influences on Canadian choral music:

- Folk music element (esp. English, French and First Nations) -- look for Andrew Balfour for the latter; also be aware of the developing growth of choral music in Labrador where First Nations residents were colonized by the Mennonites
 - *Carrickfergus* (Sirett)
 - *Grandmother moon* (Daley)
- Nature elements (vast landscape)
 - *The cold demands a silence* (Chatman)
 - Night vision (Chatman)
- o Art music (traditional western art music forms, similar to American trends)
 - From sacred roots *Ave verum corpus* (Martin)
 - *All this night* (Daley)
 - From secular roots -- *The cloud* (Chatman)
 - Music comes (Henderson)
 - *Sing your song* (Emery)
