

E. C. and N. W. Hold Regional Elections

Elected as Ohio regional chairman under our new constitution for the first time are Earl Lehman of Bluffton, N.W. Region, and William Hamilton of North Canton, E.C. Region. They succeed John Van Nice and Nancy Twitchell and must, as their first task, appoint a staff of three district chairmen.

They will conduct Regional Clinics, contact new members, represent the "Ohio A.C.D.A News" in their areas, and serve on the state executive board. The membership of the other three Ohio regions will hold their first election for new regional chairmen next February.



Our Ohio Constitutional Changes

Our National A.C.D.A. was originally controlled by a rather loosely structured constitution at its' inception in Kansas City 10 years ago to allow for quick growth. Now that a large organization exists with complex problems, the constitution has been completely revised within the past ytar.

In 1967 it became obvious that Ohios growing 200 member chapter was becoming too large for one person to administer. The first constitutional committee was then appointed and put to work to prepare the Articles and By-Laws which were adopted as the Constitution of Ohio A.C.D.A. in late 1967. Our first constitution was modeled after both the original 1960 National A.C.D.A. and the current O.M.E.A. constitutions by George Wilson, Larry Tagg, and Nancy Twitchell. Cal Rogers, then President of O.M.E.A., gave much needed assistance. The one obvious weak point in our first vehicle was the overloading of appointees rather than elected officers on the Advisory Board. This was allowed in order to get the fledgling organization launched, knowing we would try to remedy the situation as soon as possible.

Our revised constitution now makes it possible for all executive positions and regional chairmen to be elective offices. The new office of President-Elect will allow for a smoother and more knowledgeable transition at the start of a new term. renaming the Advisory Board as Board of Directors, it will be possible to add an "Advisory Council" when feasible. drawn from former Board Members, whose duties will include continuous constitutional review and improvement, history and records, and other duties similar to those of the National Advisory Council.

These changes have been caused by our contining growth as a State Organization. It is this writer's hope that we shall need further changes for the same reason.
