As I write this we have recently finished our term exams and, while I'm on a question-answer kick, let me pose a few to you-for instance: Give five reasons why you joined ACDA? What, specifically, does it furnish to you professionally that you can not get easily elsewhere? Why don't you tell your non-member friends of your good fortune so that they can have the same opportunities for professional advancement through the organization that you have? How can our state ACDA serve you even better? What contributions are you willing to make to help accomplish these improvements?

In the mean time let me write about some things which may certainly be ACDA's answer to some of those questions. Recently I returned from a meeting of the Planning Committee for the Fifth Annual ACDA of Ohio Convention which is to be held at Wittenberg College from noon of Dednesday, June 16 through noon of

Our three week stay began with tours of both the inner city of Vienna and the other regions of the area. The homes of Hugo Wolf and Beethoven were also seen.

The instruction days were organized with two lectures/demonstrations each morning and another lecture in the afternoon followed by a two hour rehearsal. Classwork delt with score analysis of Mendelssohn's "Elijah," vocal production by Herr Grossman, past director of the Vienna Boys Choir, choral techniques and conducting by Prof. Guenther Thoring as well as musicology lectures on Austrian Romantic music. Two sessions were devoted to the style and performance of German lied.
