Reviews of newer choral music:

In this issue we shall take a look at a variety of music, some intended for young voices, some for adult choirs; most are primarily for church use.

HEAR MY WORDS - Stephen Paulus (two-part, accompanied) Hinshaw Music, HMC-201
A tuneful and graceful setting of the Psalter version of Psalm 5 by this outstanding and prolific young composer.
Mostly unison, the second part consists of a descant on the final stanza. Good accompaniment.

O LAMB OF GOD MOST HOLY - arr. Gerhard Krapf (SAB) Augsburg, #11-1779

An easy unaccompanied setting of the familiar chorale tune. Interesting voice leading; could be done by a youth choir; adults will enjoy working with it.

GIVE TO OUR GOD IMMORTAL PRAISE - arr.
Donald Busarow (SAB, cong.) Augsburg, #111823

Good setting of "Duke Street" by the talented professor of organ at Wittenberg Univ. Congregations enjoy joining in on anthems, and this setting gives them an opportunity to do that. Quite easy: mostly unison with good accompaniment.

THE JESUS GIFT - Gilbert Martin (SATB)
Hinshaw Music, HMC-235
Martin is a talented composer; he also wrote
the text, which is unusual and provocative;
good part-writing, interesting accompaniment,
medium voice solo; well worth considering
for school or church use.

O THOU WHO CLOTHEST THE LILY - Normand Lockwood (SATB) Sugsburg, #11-1781
A very brief but very beautiful setting of a poem by Richard Euringer. Almost chantlike, with parts sustaining long notes while other parts are moving: music with quality

SINNER MAN - arr. Roger Emerson (three-part mixed) Jenson Publications, #403-19010
A rhythmically exciting setting of the spiritual by this talented young composerarranger. You will be hearing a lot more from him. Voice parts easy but interesting. Accompaniment calls for piano, bass and percussion.

#### RULES - STUDENT CHORAL COMPOSITION

The following rules were presented and approved at the general meeting June 15, 1977, during the summer convention at Miami U. For deadline dates and other information, contact: Martha Rice

 The composer must be: (a) a student in an accredited Ohio high school or (b) an undergraduate student in any Ohio college or university.

2. The composition must be original material not an arrangement.

3. The composition may be for any combination of voices, accompanied or unaccompanied. If accompanied, the accompaniment should not exceed five to seven minutes.

4. It is suggested that the composition be from 3 to 6 minutes in duration.

- 5. The text, of the composer's choosing, may be sacred or secular. However, the text should be either in public domain, free of copyright encumbrances, or the composer should have permission from the present copyright holders.
- 6. The composition may be designed for a choir of any age level. The composition will be evaluated in terms of the musical setting of the text, rather than the musical degree of difficulty within the composition.

7. The composition(s) should be notated in ink on regular manuscript paper.

8. All compositions will be returned to the composer with attached comments of judges.

9. The winning compositions will be performed at the summer convention.

10. The decisions of the judges will be final.
The judges reserve the right not to select
a winning composition if, in their opinion,
none of the works submitted merit such
recognition.

11. Providing winning compositions are selected the following prizes will be awarded at both the high school and college-university levels: first prize \$50.00; second prize \$25.00. Winners will be notified by mail and checks sent.

12. Care will be taken of the compositions, however, no responsibility will be assumed for compositions which are lost or damaged.

13. All compositions should be submitted to the composition contest chairman.

### EDUCATOR'S MUSIC ANNEX

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
