# Ohio ACDA to Host Howard S. Swan as Guest Conductor/Lecturer

Ohio ACDA announces plans for their 13th annual summer conference. The conference will be held in the new music, speech, and theatre arts building on the University of Akron campus July 22-25. During the conference, the newly formed University of Akron Graduate Chorale will be performing and will be used as a demonstration choir for all of Dr. Swan's lecturers, for both conducting competitions, and for the final concert performance on the last night of the conference

Topics which will be discussed during the course of the conference will focus on repertoire, style, and tone as they relate to various style periods. Dr. Swan's lectures will utilize music from the Renaissance, Baroque, Classic, and Romanic periods and will relate to the building of tone as a means of eliciting stylistic responses from the in singing pieces from each period.

Included in the conference will be the third annual conductors competition split into two separate sections; one with eligibility restricted to high school students, and one with eligibility ty restricted to undergraduates. Many publishers and other exhibitors from throughout the state will be in attendance, and a focal point of each day will be reading sessions of music appropriate to various specialized areas.

Two hours of undergraduate, postbaccalaureate, or graduate credit is being offered for attendance at this conference. Further information about any facet of this event can be obtained by writing to Dr. Frank C. Jacobs, Director of Choral Activities, University of Akron, Akron, Ohio 44325.

# Dr. Howard S. Swan

Howard S. Swan, affectionately referred to by his students as the 'Dean of American choral directors" has most certainly influenced as many choral directors as any other single individual in this or any other country Dr. Swan was professor of music Occidental, Los Angeles from 1934 until his retirement in 1971. He then assumed full responsibility for the graduate division of the choral program at the California State University in Fullerton until his retirement from teaching in 1977.

He is a member of MENC and of the honorary music fraternity Phi Kap-pa Lamda. He is a founder of the Choral Conductors Guild of California and has been elected to honorary life membership in the American Choral Directors Association and Phi Mu Alpha. His full biography appears in

"Who's Who in America."

Author of the book, Music in the Southwest, and one of six conducto contributing to the volume, Choral Conducting: A Symposium, Dr. Swan is in constant demand as a lecturer, writer, and guest conductor. He has contributed articles to the Choral Journal of the Huntington Library, the Diapason, the Choral Conducting Guild, and the American Choral Association and the publications of the

Book Club of California.

Dr. Swan has conducted choral festivals and presented clinics throughout the United States and Canada. He was one of eleven American Choral Conductors to receive a Ford Foundation Fellowship in 1963, and he has just recently completed an article on "Music in Los Angeles" for the forthcoming edition of Groves Dictionary of Music. His innate musical ability and sensitivity in the art of communication make him constantly sought after as a conductor constantly sought after as a confucctor and teacher of choral festivals, workshops, clinics, summer music camps, and all-state music festivals everywhere good choral music is per-formed.
