# Ohio Honors Chorale...A Singing Success! Beverlie Mayer and Herman Dooley

The fourth Ohio Honors Chorale has returned home with accolades, a surprise concert of great honor, and many beautiful memories. Already plans are developing for the fifth year tour which will concentrate on England and Scotland but which will include Paris, Mannheim, and Amsterdam.

The concert of great honor occurred in Cologne. As was our want, we received permission to sing an impromptu mini-concert in front of the steps of the high altar of Cologne Cathedral because the altar area itself was roped off. As the choir was performing their third Latin number, a red-hatted gentleman approached one of the directors who was not conducting at the time. He spoke in meticulous English. "I would like to ask a very great favor of this beautiful singing group. We are to be

honored by an official visit of the wife of the President of France, Mme. Giscard d'Estaing. It would give us great pleasure to have this fine choir sing the background music for her visit." And so, in response to the invitation of no less a personage than the Cardinal of Cologne, Jakob Schlafke, the Ohio Honors Chorale sang. After Mme. d'Estaing departed, the Cardinal returned. He carried a beautiful book of his writing about the cathedral. He inscribed in this book to the choir as they sang several more numbers just for him. He greeted each director graciously and by name and he took the time to talk with many of the young people. And he extended, at the end of the evening, a warm invitation to return another year and sing in the Dom.

Each concert brought a new experience. We cannot forget the treelined park of Baden bei Wein, or the downpour of rain as choir members sang their hearts out on the steps of the Town Hall of the beautiful walled city of Rothenburg. We will remember the gorgeous sound in the various cathedrals where the high-vaulted ceilings echoed the beautiful harmonies and gave a new understanding of the musical concepts inherent in the early church literature. It was really a thrill to see an American tour arrive at our concert in Regensburg on the fourth of July and an even greater thrill to see them jump to their feet and join us in the singing of "God Bless America.

Ohio Honors Chorale was founded by John Williams of Wittenberg University when he was president of Ohio ACDA. The directors he involved have carried on his principles of high choral achievement in the singing of good choral literature. Robert Moore of Oxford has been the managing director for two years and he has been assisted by many ACDA directors over the state. Those who toured this year were Beverlie Mayer of Sandusky, Vera Smith of Athens, Herman Dooley of Troy, and Betty Davis of Alliance who was the official accompanist.

With completed try-outs and acceptance, forty-four singers from all over the state of Ohio gathered at Kenyon College on June 18 for the beginning of a beautiful experience. Concentrated rehearsal produced a pre-tour concert on Saturday afternoon of twenty-five members. This concert gave us a good indication of the refinement that was to come in both tone quality and in interpretation.

# ACDA President's Column

There is an old adage about a silk purse and a sow's ear. I was reminded of it last spring while adjudicating at one of the OMEA state-level choral contests.

It was a large contest (one and onehalf days) with fine diversification... homogeneous as well as heterogeneous groups from an ample number of both large and small schools.

As in any contest of its type, the various choruses demonstrated a wide range in choral ability, in musicianship, and in their choice of literature. As I listened and evaluated their collective endeavors, it became more and more apparent to me that those groups whose directors had built their programs on fine literature masterpieces of the "choral art" - performed with more musical understanding regardless of the size of the school they represented or the classification they entered.

There is a corollary between the quality of literature upon which any music ensemble builds its program and the resultant quality of the ensemble's musicianship. Many teachers and conductors have known this for a long time. In recent years, however, it seems that more and more choral directors are following "paths of less And these "paths", resistance." however well-intentioned and/or rationalize, are leading in directions which are counter productive to the musical and educational goals which both ACDA and OMEA support and which the participating singers deserve.

This problem is not limited to choral groups in educational institutions. The current trend in many church choir programs toward a style termed "contemporary Christian music" has similarly widened the musical quality of these groups as well as the choir's ability to contribute to the total worship experience of the congragations they serve. How can these pieces, characterized as they are by weak, non-scriptural texts and less than inspired melodic and rhythmic invention elevate and inspire worshippers...or singers?

I have heard all of the rationales and they are many. They usually center either on the taste and appreciation-level of the members of the performing group and their audience or congregation or on the

materials available today from the publishing industry. Both of these ra tionales are weak. One is dictated by taste and consciousness of style and is, in all probability, nurtured by commercial television. The other reflects directly back upon the choral director who seems willing to buy almost anything found in print. We don't have to buy anything we really do not want! We can always go to our files and libraries for the "timeless" music of composers from earlier eras. Much of that music is as vital and meaningful today as it was when it was first written. And the texts and musical struc tures can build "silk purse" kinds of programs.

The year lies ahead for each of us. To a large extent the success of our programs, if we are to measure success in terms such as educational value, growth in musicianship and contribution to worship, will depend on the materials we as directors choose for our singers. My hope is that we, the choral leadership in the state of Ohio, can take a position of strength and leadership and make the words "choral art" really meaningful in our churches and schools.

# The Coshocton Show Choir Invitational

The Coshocton Music Boosters, Inc. and ESSENCE, the Coshocton High School Show Choir, are sponsoring the Second Annual Coshocton Show Choir Invitational to be held on Saturday, March 7, 1981 from 10:00 a.m. until approximately 6:00 p.m. at Coshocton High School in McKinley Auditorium. This competition is for jazz/swing/show choirs from schools in Ohio and is by invitation only. Competition last year included performances by choirs from Cincinnati, Dayton, Fredericktown, Danville, New Concord, Warsaw, and West Lafayette. Due to last year's response, we are increasing the number of participating choirs from eight to twelve.

Last year's competition was adjudicated by Dr. Paul Traver (Choral Director at the University of Maryland), Mrs. Margaret Stephenson (Head of the Voice Division of the School of Music at Ohio University), Mr. J. Eugene McKinley (Director of the Scarlet and Gray Show at Ohio State University), and Mr. Paul Criswell (Instructor in Voice at Bethany College). Adjudicators for the coming contest are now being selected and will represent the areas of vocal technique, show choir technique, and choreography.

All competing choirs will receive a plaque honoring their participation. The second runner-up, first runner-up, and Grand Champion choirs will receive trophies and automatic invitations to next year's competition.

On June 23 we left from Detroit and flew into Brussels, Belgium where we were greeted by John Witte, head of arrangements for Witte and Sons. We were introduced to our tour guide, Philip Wootenb, a young Dutch medical student. Philip had accompanied us last year and had evidenced a superb command of English and fine rapport with Chorale members. We then began our tour to Luxembourg young feet walked with thoughtful steps through the rows of white crosses and Stars of David. When the Chorale gathered on the steps of the beautiful memorial of this large American Cemetary of World War II, there were tears flowing freely as they sang, "The Lord Bless You And Keep You.

In Colmar, France we were the home guests of Colmar Kiwanis Club. A few students had language problems but their good nature and enthusiasm carried them through and provided a wonderful lesson in the value of communication. The Kiwanis Club had arranged a tour with a fine English-speaking guide through the newly-opened Betholdi Museum where the sketches and sculptures which culminated in the Statue of Liberty were beautifully displayed.

We saw Heidelberg Castle, the Bastogne Memorial, the Rhine Falls, the Bodensee, the Arlberg Pass, Innsbruck, the ski-runs left from a former Olymmpics, Rattenburg, Salzburg, Vienna, Nuremburg, Rothenburg and finally St. Bonifatius Church in Mannheim. Here we renewed warm friendships made over four years of staying with members of the parish.

We sang for the mass and followed that with a light concert at the party for parishioners and "The American Choir" (as we were called.) We travelled on the Rhine to Cologne, then to Maasterick, and then we took a canal boat trip in Amsterdam. At last we were home and sang a concert hosted by the parents of Fostorial Chorale members in the Fostoria Lutheran Church.

Next year is reunion year and many members of the Honors Chorale are planning to tour again. Auditions for new members have seen set for November 15, 1980 at Grove City High School. ACDA members are urged to encourage their best singers to be present at this first audition. Interest has grown tremendously and we expect to fill our quota early. If we do, the January audition will be cancelled.

# Sixth National ACDA Convention

The Sixth National Convention of the American Choral Directors Association will be held in the Marriott Hotel in historic New Orleans, March 5-7 of 1981.

Of particular interest and value to elementary, junior high, and secondary school and college choir directors will be the performance of a wide spectrum of choral music by nationally auditioned choirs from various academic levels. These include, in part, children's choir, boys' choir, junior high school choir, senior high school choir, college and university choirs, treble choir, and male choir, as well as vocal jazz and show choirs.

Simultaneous interest sessions will be devoted to pertinent aspects of the choral tradition. A dialogue between composer and conductor will focus upon communication and its effect on music making. A performance by combined male choruses will be among the highlights. An unusual event, a river boat cruise, is planned during which vocal jazz and show choirs will entertain those aboard. An Ecumenical Church Service in The New Orleans Saint Louis Cathedral will feature music appropriate to the church in a service setting.

The culmination of the Convention will be the performance of the Beethoven MISSA SOLEMNIS by 240 highly select choristers, the Atlanta Symphony, and four outstanding soloists, under the baton of the celebrated choral authority, director, and orchestral conductor. Robert Shaw.

ARTICLE I - NAME

  ARTICLE II PURPOSES

  1. To foster and promote choral singing that will provide artistic, cultural and spirtual experiences for the participants.

  2. To foster and promote the finest types of choral music to make these experiences possible.

  1. To provide guidance, encouragement and opportunities for conductors beginning in the field of choral music.

  1. To foster and promote the organization and development of choral groups of all types in schools and colleges.

  3. To foster and promote the organization and development of choral social continuation.

# ARTICLE IV - AUTONOMY AND ORGANIZATION

Section 1: This organization shall be constituted as a non-profit, educational association.

Section 2: The fundamental authority and responsibility of the Association shall reside in the corporate active membership and shall be exercised by the free expression and vote of each includual members, by representative legislative powers vested in the Board of Directors and by the executive powers delegated to the officers.

Section 3: Neither the Board of Directors, nor any member hereof, nor any member shall be required to accept financial esponsibility for duly authorized activities of the Association car-ied on in good faith and in pursuit of the purposes and activities prescribed or authorized by the Constitution and By-laws.

Section 5: The membership shall be organized, as a convenience in planning and executing some of the activities and programs of the Association, according to geographic regions of the State of Ohio. The regions, being defined in the By-laws, shall be named: Northwest, Northeast, South-Central, Southwest

# ARTICLE V - STATE OFFICERS

Section 1: The Officers of the Association shall be as follows: President, Vice-President, President-Elect, Treasurer, Secretary

Section 2: The President-Elect shall be elected by ballot during a business meeting or by mail as provided in the By-laws. He/she shall serve a term of two years beginning on July 1 of uneven-numbered years. At the end of his/her term, the President-Elect shall automatically succeed to the office of President.

Section 3: The Treasurer shall be elected by ballot during a business meeting or by mail as provided in the By-laws. He/she shall serve a term of two years beginning on July 1 of even-numbered years.

Section 4: The Secretary shall be elected by ballot during a business meeting or by mail as provided in the By-laws. Het/she shall serve a term of two years beginning on July 1 of unrennumbered years.

Section 5: Regional Chairpersons shall be elected by ballot during a business meeting or by mail as provided in the By-laws. They shall serve a term of two years according to the following: Northeast, South-Central and Southwest Regional Chairpersons beginning on July 1 of unrennersheeping on July 1 of seven-numbered years.

# ARTICLE VI - APPOINTED OFFICIALS

Section 1: Appointed Officials shall be the Editor of the Ohio News, all Chairpersons of Standing Committees and Special Committees. They shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Direction. The office of Editor of the Ohio News may be assigned to one person at the discretion of the President and the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE VII - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1: The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, the Vice-President, the President-Elect, the Treasurer and the Secretary.

Section 2: Any vacancy occurring on the Executive Committee, with the exception of that of President, shall be filled from the active membership by Executive Committee appointment with the approval of the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE VIII - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1: The Board of Directors shall consist of the Executive Committee, the Regional Chairpersons and the Editor of the Ohio News. Chairpersons of Standing Committees and Special Committees shall be ex-officio members.

# ARTICLE IX - PAST PRESIDENTS ADVISORY COUNCIL

Section 1: There shall be a Past Presidents Advisory Council consisting of the Past Presidents of the Association.

Section 2: In the event that the immediate past Vice-President is unable to serve as Chairperson, the President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, shall appoint a person to chair the Council.

Section 3: The Chairperson of the Past President's Advisory Council shall appoint a member of the Council to serve as recording secretary of that group for the purpose of keeping minutes of Council meetings.

# ARTICLE X - MEETINGS

Section 1: Business meetings of the Association shall be held at least annually at a time and place determined by the Board of Directors, usually during conventions.

Section 2: Bi-Annual meetings of the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors shall be called by the President to conduct the business of the Association.

Section 3: Other meetings of the officers or the Executive Com-

Section 4. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President or upon the signed petition of three regional chairprosons and two other elected members of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. The call for special meetings of the Board of Directors must state the business to be transacted. No business shall be transacted except that specified in the call without approval of the majority of the members of the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE XI - QUORUM

Section 1: The quorum of the Executive Committee shall be three of the five voting members of that Committee.

Section 2: The quorum of the Board of Directors shall be seven members of the Board including four voting members of the Ex-ecutive Committee and three Regional Chairpersons.

Section 3: The quorum of the Association for the transaction obusiness at business meetings shall consist of a quorum of the Board of Directors, as stated above, plus the active membership present and voting.

## ARTICLE XII - AMENDMENTS

Section 1: Amendments and/or revisions to this Constitution may be initiated by the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors or by a petition signed by ten per cent of the state membership from no fewer than three of the regions of the Association.


# ARTICLE XV - AMENDMENTS
