Church Music Workshop in Dayton

The 28th Annual Church Music Workshop of Dayton, Ohio will take place October 9th and 10th at Westminster Presbyterian Church, located in downtown Dayton. The slate of clinicians promises to result in a rewarding experience for organists, directors and public school teachers who gather each year to share their goals, widen their horizons, and consider new ideas and approaches.

Joyce Jones, FAGO, DMA. Organist in residence at Baylor University, is proclaimed by critics in Europe and America as one of the world's most outstanding organists of our time. She graduated from the University of Texas with highest honors, at the age of nineteen. Her truly rare qualities enable her to inspire audiences everywhere she performs.

Eph Ehly, DMA, is head of the Choral Department at the University of Kansas City. He is considered an outstanding clinician throughout the Midwest. His choral sessions promise to be of great benefit to church and school directors.

John and Joanne Rodland (Children's Choirs) come from West Side Presbyterian Church in Ridgewood, New Jersey. Their church program includes multiple choirs, chamber orchestra, three bell choirs, and a summer music camp.

In addition to this impressive list, Andrew and Helen Flannigan, Executive Directors of AGEHR, Inc. will also be on the staff. Their classes will include music for handbells and choir, plus repertoire for handbells and organ. Rex Hicks, member of ACDA, will have classes in choral repertoire and conducting techniques for smaller choirs. John Neely, organist at Westminster Presbyterian Church, will have a session in basic organ.
