authorities on choral repertoire will share with you their latest in "choral fineries." Reading sessions have been designed to help persons working with young children's voices through the college years.

Headliners Sally Herman and Robert DeCormier will be joined by four prominent Ohio choral figures in presenting choral literature as well as focus on the training of vocal production in the choral situation. There are far too many choral conductors who have had little to no vocal training, yet are responsible for the care and development of the vocal instrument.

Sandra Stegman will lead a session in repertoire for elementary and childrens choirs. David DeVenney will present high school and college literature. William Osborne will present church repertoire suitable for all choirs (youth to adult). He will also give us his views on how much knowledge should a choral conductor possess in the area of organ registration - an intriguing question.

Two choral concerts will highlight the convention. The OSU Summer Chorus will present a concert on Friday evening. Saturday morning the Ohio Honors Chorale will present its home concert following a three week tour of Europe. Directors are: Robert Moore, Vera Smith, Miriam Gibson, Loren Veigel, and Robert Mix.
