Noted British composer ANDREW CARTER will conduct a workshop on seasonal music for church, school and community choirs on Wednesday, June 15, 4:00-6:00 and 7:00-9:00 pm, at the Worthington United Methodist Church. He will introduce music recently published by England's leading choral composers for ensembles of all levels.

Mr. Carter, a guest of the Worthington UMC 1993-94 Music Series, will conduct a concert of his music at the church on Sunday, June 19, at 7:30 pm. A performance of his Benedicite, a cantata for chorus, children's choir and orchestra will be featured, in addition to the first performance of a new hymn-anthem on "Come Down, O Love Divine" that includes congregational singing. The Children's Choir of the church will be joined by the Otterbein Kinderchor.

Interested singers are invited to participate in the concert as well as the workshop. Information is available at

the church (614/885-5365) or from Maurice Casey (614/888-7005). The fee for the four hours of the workshop will be \$20, which covers the cost of all the music presented.

AMY CHIVINGTON announces a Kinderchor Camp to be held at Otterbein College July 25-29. "Children Can Sing in Choirs!" will be a day camp for youngsters aged 8-16 that will include open rehearsals, classes on choral rehearsal techniques for young singers, choral reading sessions, and discussions of the day-to-day management of children's choirs in school, community and church environments. The Columbus Dispatch of February 6 announced that "It's on again."

"The Robert Shaw Choral Institute will resume this year under the sponsorship of three academic institutions-Boston University, Ohio State University and the University of California at Los Angeles.

"The new program will build on one underwritten by OSU alone that fell victim to university budget cuts last year. The consortium was pulled together by Donald Harris, Dean of OSU's College of the Arts.

"At each institution, Shaw, the world's best known choral conductor, will offer an annual, weeklong residenc[y]. He will meet with students in classroom and rehearsal settings, and conduct a choral-orchestral program."

This season's OSU event culminated with an all-Brahms program presented at Mershon Auditorium on March 5. The evening included Nänie, opus 82; the Alto Rhapsody, opus 53; and the Violin Concerto in D major, opus 77. The performing forces included mezzosoprano Eileen Davis, violinist Michael Davis, the OSU Chorale (Hilary Apfelstadt, conductor), Symphonic Choir and Men's Glee Club (James Gallagher, conductor) and Symphony Orchestra (Marshall Haddock, conductor).

"Shaw will also continue to direct the summer institute, a three-week program of intensive study and performance in the historic Quercy region of south-central France. The program concludes with a choral festival that features public performances in Romanesque cathedrals and churches.

The third biennial Golden Gate International Children's Choral Festival will be held in Oakland, California June 26-30, 1995. Fifteen choirs will be accepted to compete in five categories: Children's Choirs, Folk/Popular, Contemporary, Boy's Vocal Solo and Girl's Vocal Solo. There will be gala opening and closing concerts, as well as symposia for conductors and administrators. The principal adjudicator will be Bosse Johansson, founding director of the Adolf Frederiks Girls' Choir of Stockholm; Robert Geary is the festival's Artistic Director. The 1993 Gold Medalist was the Dawn Children's Choir from Moscow. 
