FROM THE OCDA 'PRESIDENT

Greetings to all of you as you finish your choral season. I hope that 1997-98 has been a successful year for you, and that you will get <u>some</u> rest and rejuvenation over the summer.

And what better way to get chorally rejuvenated than to come to the OCDA Summer Conference at Otterbein College in Westerville on June 29, 39, and July 1. I will be hosting the conference with my capable colleagues Amy Chivington and David Monseur. CEU, undergraduate and graduate credit is available. By now, you should have received the conference brochure in the mail and this newsletter contains further information, but let me expand a bit more.

First, what a trio of headliner clinicians: Sigrid Johnson of St. Olaf College, Ken Phillips of Teaching Kids to Sing fame, and our own Jim Gallagher, who has been making beautiful choral sounds in the state of Ohio for decades. These three choral experts will lead us through a variety of sessions designed to increase our knowledge of choral music, and to improve our abilities to make our choirs sound better. The techniques and materials they will be presenting will be applicable to choral ensembles on all levels and in all settings.

Second, we have a whole host of outstanding OCDA clinicians who will bring us a variety of specialized sessions in various areas of expertise: Judith Higbee from Church of the Saviour United Methodist Church in Cleveland Heights will tell us how to start a church youth choir and keep it going; David Frego of The Ohio State University will lead a Dalcroze eurhythmics session applicable to the choral ensemble; Earl Rivers of The College Conservatory of Music, University of Cincinnati, will present on polychoral music and how to make that literature come alive for you; James D. Smith, Findlay High School, his staff, and his award-winning show choir First Edition will demonstrate for you how they succeed so consistently; and Ohio University's Judy Piercy will present a fascinating session applying Myers Briggs' personality profiling techniques to you as conductors to help you be more effective in rehearsal settings.

You will be treated to twelve reading sessions, as well as to other clinics that will involve the reading of new music, and you will walk away with well over 100 pieces of quality choral music, carefully selected by OCDA's Repertoire & Standards Chairpersons. In addition, we will have exhibits that will give you the opportunity to browse for additional new materials.

Performance and demonstration choirs include the Ohio State University Men's Glee Club, the Otterbein Vocal Ensemble Bel Canto Singers, the Church of the Saviour Agape Youth Choir, Otterbein Kinderchor Chamber Choir, and the Columbus Gay Men's Chorus. And there will be plentiful opportunities to socialize with your choral colleagues from across Ohio and from neighboring states. In addition, we have designated Tuesday, June 30 as Retiree Day and Wednesday, July 1 as Student Day: please see the brochure for more information.

When I first came to Ohio in the 1980s, I did not take full advantage of the OCDA summer conferences, and once I did, I have not missed one in years. After state-wide and national surveying, we have moved the conference a bit earlier in the summer, reorganized the schedule, and expanded the program to more adequately meet your needs as choral professionals. Take time to travel to Westerville, in the center of the state, and to Otterbein College's charming campus for three chorally-enriching days: it will be time well spent.

OCDA SUMMER CONFERENCE KEYNOTE CLINICIANS

SIGRID JOHNSON

SIGRID JOHNSON is a member of the voice faculty and conductor of the Manitou Singers and Collegiate Chorale at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. The Manitou Singers is composed of 95 first year women at the college. The Collegiate Chorale has 45 singers made up of upperclass students, faculty and staff women.

Ms. Johnson holds a bachelor of music degree in voice performance from St. Cloud State University and a master of music degree in voice performance from The University of Michigan. Prior to her teaching at St. Olaf she was on the music faculties of Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter and at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis.

Ms. Johnson is the associate conductor of the Ensemble Singers and the Symphonic Chorus for Philip Brunelle's Plymouth Music Series of Minnesota. The Plymouth Music Series, now in its 28th season, presents both rarely heard and newly commissioned works for chorus and orchestra.

Additionally, she has served as conductor of the Dale Warland Symphonic Chorus and as the associate conductor of the Dale Warland Singers. She has prepared symphonic choruses for Neemi Jarvi, Sir Neville Mariner, David Zinman, Stanislaw Skrowaczewsky, Gerard Swartz, Edo de Waart and Leonard Slatkin. Ms. Johnson has recently conducted a series of choral workshops in Australia. She is a member of ACDA, MENC, and Chorus America.

KENNETH PHILLIPS

KENNETH PHILLIPS is professor of music and education at The University of Iowa, where he is the coordinator of music education and teaches courses in undergraduate and graduate methods and research. conducting, and child and adolescent voice. He received the Ph.D. in choral music education from Kent State University, where he studied conducting under Vance George, present director of the San Francisco Symphony Chorus. Dr. Phillips has been voice consultant to the San Francisco Symphony Chorus since 1986, and presently directs the Cedar Rapids Symphony Children's Discovery Chorus, and Chamber Singers of Iowa City. He has presented over 100 sessions in 25 states and Canada on child and adolescent voice, including regional, state, and national conferences of MENC, OAKE, and ACDA.

Dr. Phillips has a broad background in teaching, which includes experience in elementary, secondary, higher education and church music. He is the author of over 50 journal articles, a chapter on "Research on the Teaching of Singing" in The Handbook of Research on Music Teaching and Learning, and a book, video series, and exercise and vocalise cards on Teaching Kids To Sing. His latest book, Basic Techniques of Conducting (1997) is published by Oxford University Press. The University of Iowa has recognized his teaching with three excellence in teaching awards. It is Dr. Phillips' conviction that all children can be taught to sing with confidence when provided with a developmental program of psychomotor skills instruction.

JAMES GALLAGHER

JAMES GALLAGHER is Director of Choral Studies at The Ohio State University, where he conducts the Men's Glee Club, Symphonic Choir, and teaches conducting, vocal pedagogy and choral repertoire.

Mr. Gallagher received a bachelor's degree from Otterbein College and holds a Master of Arts degree in music education from The Ohio State University. Additional study has taken place at Westminster Choir College, the Pennsylvania State University, Eastern Michigan University and Indiana State University. Mr. Gallagher has studied privately or worked extensively with such conductors as Paul Salamunovich, Joseph Flummerfelt, Sir David Willcocks and Robert Shaw.

Mr. Gallagher was the conductor of the Columbus Symphony Chorus for seven years and chorus master of the Columbus Symphony Opera Chorus for two seasons. He has prepared choral masterworks for Robert Shaw, Margaret Hillis, Robert Page and Evan Whalon, and frequently conducted the Symphony Chorus and Chamber Orchestra in concert.

OSU choral ensembles under his direction have performed for state, regional and national conventions of ACDA, MENC, and OMEA. In 1990, the Men's Glee Club captured the "Choir of the World" trophy at the International Musical Eisteddfod in Llangollen, Wales. A frequent clinician, Mr. Gallagher is also director of music at Trinity United Methodist Church in Marble Cliff
